The UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (UGC-HRDC) (formerly UGC-Academic Staff College) Bangalore University, Bengaluru was established on 11th August 2000 under Ninth Plan period. It was formally inaugurated by Prof. Hari Goutham, Chairman, UGC, New Delhi. The HRDC was earlier located in the heritage building of Old Physics Block at the nationally famous Central College Campus, Bangalore University since then striving to meet the Challenges of ASC/HRDC and train the stake holders to be not only the best professional but a good human being of the society and leaders. Further it has been shifted to new building at Jnana Bharathi Campus in 2013 after the trifurcation of Bangalore University. Shortly shifting from existing building to our new independent building constructed in the Campus near the Guest House Our Centre is also a part of knowledge capital of India and integral part of Bangalore University. The objective of the HRDC is to cater to the needs of the teachers/ principals, research scholars/non-academic staff and to enhance their knowledge/skills through systematic course work and methodologies. Besides, it also focuses on different modes of approach in order to meet the challenges of life, to become not merely a trained professional but also a better citizen.

The HRDC is organizing Orientation programmes and Refresher Courses on thrust areas for in service teachers and also for newly appointed teaching faculty on a regular basis. Besides, the HRDC is conducting Workshops for College Principals, short term programmes for Research Scholars, Non-Academic Staff of the universities, and Interaction Programmes for Post Doctoral Research scholars. The HRDC has so far conducted 65 Orientation / Faculty Induction Programmes and 250 Refresher courses, 15 Short Term Courses / Workshops, 5 Principal Workshops and 10 other workshops in various faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce and Management, Education and Law will be organizing the approved courses every calendar year to develop the professionals, Researchers with leadership skills and social responsiveness. So far a total of about 10000 teacher participants and 200 Principals have attended the said courses. Our centre has achieved 17th Position out of 66 HRDCs in India as per the NAAC review during 2012.

Our HRDC is well equipped with all infrastructure, separate website and located in the area of Knowledge Capital and has an advantage certainly to enrich the knowledge of our stake holders as our city is surrounded by renowned institutions and learning centres. UGC HRDC - 22

Bangalore University UGC HRDC-A Memoir and Dream

I took charge as Vice Chancellor of Bangalore University on 11th March 1999, at the fagend of 8th plan period. Immediately after assuming charge I went and met the then Governor, Sri. Khurshid Alam Khan who is also a well-known educationist to take his blessings. The Governor spoke only a few words. "Prof. Siddappa, I wanted to appoint a senior Military Officer as Vice Chancellor of Bangalore University to bring discipline as it is in a total chaotic state. But rules did not permit and so I have selected you after perusing meticulously the Bio data of the three candidates in the panel recommended by the search committee. I have done this with a hope that you will be able to bring discipline in Bangalore University. I do not know what you do, and how you do it, but I want you to bring discipline. I wish you good luck. His blessing words became my mission

I studied the prevailing situation and I found the entire system of the University was in chaos and the discipline was awfully bad. In particular the financial administration was so bad that even the pension find was totally exhausted and there was no money left to the retiring staff to settle their pension. Also, the finds due to the University were not collected properly. Even the UGC sanctioned funds for the plan period were only received as First instalment and the remaining three instalments were not released for want of utilisation certificates even though the University had spent lot more than the sanctioned amount. Besides, the plan period had almost come to an end. So I rushed to UGC and met the Chairman Prof. Hars Gautam and explained him the situation and sought three extension time for submitting the utilation certificate and get the funds released. He agreed and we submitted the utilisation certificate for the first instalment and got all the finds sanctioned by UGC for the plan period which was about 30 crores

The UGC Chairman appreciated the efforts and became a close well-wisher and a good friend. He entrusted me the task of reviewing the fictioning of all the academic staff colleges in the country by constituting an expert committee with myself as the Chairman. The committee completed the task in a couple of months and submitted a report. During the discussion, I made it clear to the UGC Chairman that, one of the main reasons for the unsatisfactory functioning of most of the Academic staff colleges is the wrong location centres with poor availability of experts needed for the programs. I pleaded to sanction one Academic staff college to Bangalore University where abundant expertize from national research centres and industries are available. After a continuous persuasion I got the college sanctioned as an exception to the UGC policy of not to sanction new Academic Staff Colleges.

The UGC Chairman was further kind enough to come and inaugurate the Academic Staff College on 11 Aug 2000 under the 9th plan period. The Academic Staff college (later designated as UGC Human Resource Development Centre (UGC-HRDC)) was located in the Central College campus at the Heritage Building of old physics department. The training program activities were being held in the famous Raman hall of the Physics department. A number of very relevant and innovative refresher courses and orientation programmes to college & university teachers were held by inviting experts from II.Sc., JN.C, Raman Research Institute, Indian Institute of Astro Physics, Centre for Human Genetics, TIFR Centre, ISEC and relevant industries. A strong foundation in this way was laid during my tenure.

I had a dream that Bangalore University UGC-HRDC should become a model centre in the country. Bangalore has very rich and very innovative research Professors, Entrepreneurs and Industrial experts and IAS officers having good academic interests. Therefore it is not difficult to realise the dream of making it the best HRD centre in the country. The present Director of the HRD centre and the committed staff are doing a good job in realising the dream. I am also extremely happy that the present Vice Chancellor, Registrar and Finance Officer are very proactive to academic activities. The HRDC has recently been shifted to the Gnanabharathi campus and a new dedicated building has been built with all the necessary facilities to conduct the training programmes. This would facilitate conducting the training programmes more systematically and efficiently. Therefore it is not far off to see that the dream of making the HRDC a model centre in the country is realised.

I wish the very best in the efforts of the Director and his team of HRDC, and the University authorities in this endeavour.

While Refresher courses to enhance the capacity of in service teachers by exposing them to the latest developments in their respective subjects and motivating them for Research which is also emphasised by NEP.

The Karnataka State was already having 2 such Centres one at Mysore University Campus and the other at Karnatak University Campus, Dharwad. The Bangalore University was continuously trying its best to get ASC/HRDC from the times of Hon'ble Vice Chancellors Dr. D.M. Nanjundappa, Dr. K. Hanumanthappa, and Dr. N.R. August 11th, 2000 is still green in my memory when UGC-ASC/HRDC was inaugurated by Prof. Hari Goutam, Chairman UGC, New Delhi, Dr. G. Parameshwar Hon'ble minister for Higher Education, Government of Karnataka as Chief Guest Presided by Prof. K. Siddappa Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.

I am extremely thankful to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. K. Siddappa for giving me an opportunity to serve as the First Director during 2000-2002. He was a great motivator and extended me full support and valuable guidance to make our ASC-HRDC as one of the best in this part of the country. Later during 2002-2003 Prof. M.S. Thimmappa Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of our University encouraged and continued his support with valuable guidance. I am happy to write that in about 6 months time we could establish full fledged ASC-HRDC with all audio visual equipments and teaching aids. During 2000-2003 when I was Director nearly 1500 teachers across the State and also from other States got the benefit of undergoing the training. Some of the participants got motivation to do PhD and acknowledged later. As former Director hearing the achievements of our participants felt happy, because

one of the purposes of HRDC to motivate teachers for doing Research was fulfilled though not in big measure.

During my tenure eminent Educationists, Thinkers, Writers, Scientists, Philosphers, Beaurocrats, Social Scientists, delivered lectures in our Programmes/ Courses conducted by ASC/HRDC Professors and Vice Chancellors Viz. 

Policy on Education 1986 (NPE) had suggested that the present educational system does not provide opportunities to the teachers for professional and career development, initiative for innovative and creative work, and internalizing the techniques and value system to fulfil their roles and responsibilities For improving the quality of higher education, different Commissions including Radhakrishnan Commission (1948) and Kothari Commission (1966) on higher education have recommended a sustained and purposeful development of Human Resource Development Centres. The Programme of action of NEP 1986 categorically mentioned a comprehensive programme of professional development through UGC-ASC's, With a view to provide opportunity for inservice college and university teachers to update their professional knowledge linking to career advancement through establishment of 46 ASC's across the country in 1987, later Re-named as HRDC's.

Subsequently several other Universities in the country followed the suite including Bangalore University by establishing the ASC in 2000 and at presentHRDC, for updating the knowledge, competence and skills in higher education of the teachers through Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, Shortterm Courses and Workshops. Bangalore University has further gone beyond in venturing into organizing training programmes for non-teaching staff to meet the challenges pertaining to office keeping, digitalized competition and latest developments in financial, administrative and academic issues. Apart from this the HRDC conducts workshops to Research Scholars to train them in Research Methodology, developing understanding in thrust areas of Research and use of Technology in Research.

Bangalore University UGC-HRDC so far has trained thousands of teachers in the state as well as across the country through its transparent selection mode based on seniority and 10% reservation to other states in the country. Throughout, thrust areas were selected for all types of training programmes, whether; they are Orientation programmes, Refresher Courses, Short-term Courses or Workshops. Discipline wise Refreshers are organised in all the subject areas independently as well as combining the allied subjects

through Interdisciplinary and Multidisciplinary approach.

I have been associated with Bangalore University UGC-HRDC since its inception till present, because of the Centre's sustained seriousness in organising the programmes. So far hundreds of programmes have been organised by Bangalore University UGC-HRDC. My association with UGC – HRDC Bangalore center started from March 2008, when I attended my Orientation program. It was then called as UGC – ASC (Academic Staff College) and was located in the Physics Block in Central college campus. I was selected by KPSC in 2007 for the Assistant Professor's post in History. Since Orientation program and Refresher course have been mandatory for probationary declaration and further promotions, It was a highly refreshing, intellectual and wellorganized program. Since then, I have attended one each Orientation program, Refresher course, Refresher course (winter school), Short term course (offline) and Every program has been conducted as per schedule with right modules for the benefit of the participants. 


